Lifting Young Voices is a programme that promotes the joy of singing by offering highly experienced and well-qualified choral trainers to deliver weekly whole-class singing lessons across all of KS2.

It is delivered by the music department at All Saints Kingston, which has long been regarded as having one of the leading parish church choirs in the country. It has recently received long-term funding to expand its team of expert Choral Trainers in order to offer whole-class singing tuition to local primary schools.



What it costs:

- Funding from the Diocese of Southwark and other grantmaking bodies enables us to offer the programme FREE for the first year.
- After that, we charge equivalent rates to Kingston Music Service (currently £450 per term)

What we offer:

- An experienced Choral Trainer visiting once a week for 1.5 hours, usually delivering two 45-minute sessions.
- Whole-class singing sessions which fulfil many of the elements of the National Curriculum music requirements for KS2.
- Schools can choose which year groups they work with each term.
- A broad repertoire is used and can be tailored to the wishes of the school.
- Participating schools and year groups are invited to a termly concert at All Saints Church, performing an individual piece and then a collective piece that is sung with all the schools and the church's Junior Choir.
