<u>Readings</u>

Isaiah 43: 16-21

Thus says the Lord, who makes a way in the sea, a path in the mighty waters, who brings out chariot and horse, army and warrior; they lie down, they cannot rise, they are extinguished, quenched like a wick: Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. The wild animals will honour me, the jackals and the ostriches; for I give water in the wilderness, rivers in the desert, to give drink to my chosen people, the people whom I formed for myself so that they might declare my praise.

John 12: 1-8

Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him. Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, 'Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?' (He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) Jesus said, 'Leave her alone. She bought it so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me.'

THE DECLARATION OF ASSENT AND THE OATHS

Preface (spoken by the Archdeacon)

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion, The Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons. In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making Him known to those in your care?

Declaration of Assent

I, Sylvia Collins-Mayo, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will use only the forms of service which are authorized or allowed by Canon.

Oath of Allegiance

I, Sylvia Collins-Mayo, do swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty King Charles III, his heirs and successors, according to law: So help me God.

Oath of Canonical Obedience

I, Sylvia Collins-Mayo, do swear by Almighty God that I will pay true and canonical obedience to the Lord Bishop of Southwark and his successors, in all things lawful and honest. So help me God.

THE REAFFIRMATION OF ORDINATION VOWS

Sylvia, before you receive this share in the Bishop's pastoral charge Archdeacon will you, before God and this congregation, renew your dedication to Christ as a priest of the new covenant? I will

1:30pm Sung Liturgy for Good Friday The climax of our Good Friday worship is the singing of St John's Passion (music by Victoria) and the Veneration of the Cross. Communion is offered from the reserved sacrament that was consecrated on Maundy Thursday.

<u>Easter Sunday – 20th April</u> 6am Dawn Service Starting with vigil readings in the dark church, then the lighting of the fire in the churchyard and taking the new Easter Candle back into the church. The Exsultet (the Easter Song of Praise) is sung before we renew our baptism vows.

8am Holy Communion Said service in the Holy Trinity Chapel according to the Book of Common Prayer

9:30am Choral Eucharist Our principal Easter Day communion service with festive hymns and anthems, followed by refreshments and an Easter Egg hunt for children.

6pm Choral Evensong
